# **Fair Stand Positions**

# In Back

<u>Griller:</u> responsible for grilling burgers/cheeseburgers; frying onions; warming up bacon (it will be baked ahead of time this year) and putting together burger orders as needed by basket prep person

<u>Fryer:</u> responsible for making french fries, onion rings, and chicken strips for orders needed by basket prep person

<u>Basket Prep:</u> responsible for putting orders together from Order Forms; must be able to shout out what is needed to workers from Order Form; must be organized to put several orders together at 1 time; take care of pickle preference; FYI: kids menu was eliminated to streamline the orders

**Extra Kitchen Helper/Fair Stand Committee Member**: responsible for hot dogs; chicken salads; watch for refills being needed: frozen hamburger patties; cheese plate; bacon plate; pickles; buns; onions

**Safety:** Wash hands before shift; don't touch face/mouth with hands while working; wipe off sweat with paper towel/wash hands; wear gloves if prepping food; take off apron during breaks

<u>Clothing:</u> wear T-shirt/not tank top; appropriate length shorts; closed toe shoes; keep hair back

# **Fair Stand Positions**

# **In Front**

<u>Adult Server:</u> Connect with Adult Server from last shift to see if any items are sold out and whose orders haven't been taken yet; connect with servers on your shift; assign each a section; review Order Form with them; make sure they sign up with Cashier for free meal; give servers breaks as needed; watch items on Duty List; assign to server when not busy

<u>Servers</u>: Check in with Adult Server on shift for section assignment; sign in with cashier for free meal; let Adult Server know if you need a break; finish serving any orders taken at shift change; watch items on Duty List during any slow or down times

<u>Duties to Cover in Front</u>: Keep ketchup, mustard, salt, pepper, Ranch/French dressing filled; organize pop cooler; keep countertops clean and organized; make iced tea and lemonade when needed

<u>Safety:</u> Wash hands before shift; don't touch face/mouth with hands while working; wipe off sweat with paper towel/wash hands; wear gloves if prepping food; take off apron during breaks

<u>Clothing:</u> wear T-shirt/not tank top; appropriate length shorts; closed toe shoes; keep hair back
