Lighting of the Advent Candles

Advent is the period of four weeks before Christmas. The word itself means 'coming' in Latin, and so Advent is a celebration of waiting, of anticipating Christ Jesus' arrival into our world.

There are three times of 'coming' that Christians observe during Advent. The first happened about 2,000 years ago when Jesus – God Himself – entered into our human existence as a baby. He then lived a wholly good life, a life He came to willingly sacrificed on the cross. Three days later, Jesus Christ rose again, promising forgiveness of sins and eternal life to all who know and follow Him. The second 'coming,' therefore, can happen now! Jesus offers to enter into our lives, to guide us through our every day. Finally, the third 'coming' will happen in the future. Jesus has promised to return to us, to begin the final and never-ending age of God's new creation.

Please join us now as we eagerly await the coming of Christ Jesus!

The Nicene Creed
