Welcome to our Good Friday Tenebrae Worship Service! *Tenebrae* is the Latin word for "shadows," and this type of worship has been practiced in Christian Church since the fourth century. During the service, our readers will recall the events that led Jesus Christ to the cross, and we will extinguish thirteen candles, one by one, dramatizing His suffering and death. The diminishing light symbolizes the fading devotion of Jesus Christ's followers – the disciples – and our sins, which add to the world's brokenness. At the end of the worship service, the sanctuary will be as dark and silent as Christ's tomb.

ALL: Almighty God, You came to us. When You lived among us as Christ Jesus, Your life was pure light in our dim world, the Light meant to guide us all. Humanity, Your dearest creation, rejected You. But we have heard the good news: whoever does believe You, whoever accepts You, will become a child of God.
