Lighting of the Advent Candles

Advent is the period of four weeks that prepare us for Christmas. The word itself means 'forthcoming' in Latin, because Advent is a celebration of waiting, of anticipating Christ Jesus' arrival in our world.

There are three episodes of 'forthcoming' that Christians observe during Advent. The first happened about 2,000 years ago when Jesus – God Himself – entered into our human existence as a baby. He then lived a wholly good life, a life He came to willingly sacrificed on the cross. Three days later, Jesus Christ rose again, promising forgiveness of sins and eternal life to all who know and follow Him. This gives us the second 'forthcoming' – yes, it happens to us today! Jesus offers to enter into our lives, to guide us through every twist and turn. Finally, the third 'forthcoming' will happen in the future. Jesus has promised to return to us, to complete the never-ending age of God's Kingdom.

Please join us now as we eagerly await the coming of Christ Jesus!

+ Confession and Forgiveness

PASTOR: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

ALL: Amen.

PASTOR: Almighty God, we have gathered today to wait. We join the people of the Bible who, from the very beginning, have waited for their reunion with You.

ALL: We wait for Heaven on earth, for Your eternal Paradise.

PASTOR: But our patience is tested. As every day passes, we discover more reasons for despair, for apathy, for depression and restlessness. Besides You, O LORD, everything is tainted and everyone is flawed. How can we survive such a broken world?

ALL: We need a Savior! Rescue us, LORD God. Find us in the darkness and bring us into Your light!

PASTOR: In this season of Advent, we wait. Christmas is almost here, and it is then that we will celebrate what God has done. When He came to us, when God Himself was born as Jesus Christ, it was to give us what we need most: hope, love, joy, and peace. Jesus' perfectly honorable life, and His sacrificial suffering and death, save us. Our Lord and Savior rescues us, forgiving our sinful failures while keeping us from the consequence of death. Then, by His defeat of the grave, Jesus promises a new and eternal life with Him.

ALL: We wait for the perfection of that new life. Until the fullness of Heaven comes, we gladly wait! Amen.

Prayer of the Day – Advent of Faith

ALL: Loving God, You once invited Mary and Joseph to follow You on a seemingly impossible journey, but You safely guided them through every obstacle in their path. When the roads of our own lives seem difficult and dangerous, be with us in the same way. As You once brought Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem, to that moment when they met You face-to-face, lead us now. Amen.




