**Proposed Changes to Constitution Bylaws:** 

Proposed clarification to the Constitution Bylaws regarding council meetings. The proposed language intends to define 'Whole Council' and 'Executive Council' as well as how often members are required to attend. Current Language:

The Church Council shall conduct meetings of the whole council at least one each quarter; as a whole or executive committee (consisting of the officers and the chairperson of each board or designee) shall meet at least monthly; at a time and place as the council itself shall decide.

The members of the Church Council shall be:

- 1. Officers of the congregation;
- 2. All members of the Board of Trustees and the Board of Deacon;
- 3. A representative of the Board of Education, Fair Stand Board, and Memorial Board;
- 4. *Pastor(s), serving as advisory member(s) by virtue of office, but without vote;*
- 5. Immediate past-president to serve one year.

<u>Proposed change to language:</u> The Church Council shall conduct meetings of the Executive Council (consisting of the officers and the chairperson of each board) at least monthly at a time and place as the council itself shall decide. The whole council shall meet 2 times a year with one being in January prior to the annual meeting and the other being in September or October.

The primary difference between the Whole Council and the Executive Council is regarding the Trustees and Deacons. The Whole Council includes all members of the Board of Trustees and the Board of Deacons while the Executive Council includes a requirement for a representative from the Board of Trustees and Board of Deacons.

According to the Constitution, bylaws may be adopted or amended at any legally called and conducted meeting of the congregation by a two-thirds majority vote of those present and voting. The proposed bylaws or amendments must be read at a public service of the congregation or mailed to the voting members, no less than ten days prior to the meeting.
