Tenebrae is the Latin word for "shadows", and this type of worship has been practiced in the Christian Church since the fourth century. During the service, as thirteen candles are extinguished, our readers will recall the events that led to Jesus Christ's suffering and death on the cross. The diminishing light symbolizes the fading devotion of Christ's followers – the disciples – and our own sins, which add to the world's spiritual gloom. At the end of the worship service, the sanctuary will be as dark and silent as Christ's tomb.

Confession and Forgiveness – based on Isaiah 53:3-12

PASTOR: He was despised and rejected...

ALL: ... a man of sorrows who knew true grief.

PASTOR: We turned our backs on Him, despising and ignoring Him.

ALL: But He still carried our suffering.

PASTOR: We thought His troubles were a punishment from God, a punishment for His own sins!

ALL: ... but He was pierced for our rebellion and crushed for our sins.

PASTOR: The punishment we deserved was laid on Him, and so we are healed by His bruises. His sacrifice makes us whole.

ALL: Like sheep, we have all wandered. We have strayed from God's path to follow our own...
